The session will be delivered online and will explore separation anxiety, the impact of separation anxiety on parents and how separation anxiety can maintain EBSA. 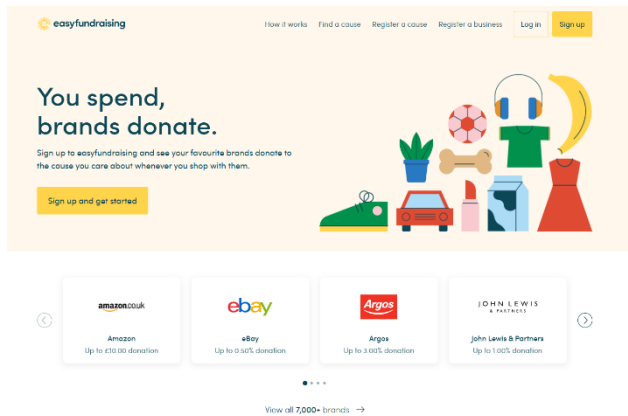
